South African Youth Congress (SAYCO)

The South African Youth Congress (SAYCO) is the largest youth organization in South Africa (representing approximately 4 million members). SAYCO is affiliated to the United Democratic Front, which is closely aligned with the African National Congress (led by Nelson Mandela). SAYCO's representatives are currently on a national tour to encourage American support for the release of Rapu Molekane (the detained SAYCO general secretary) and all political prisoners; solicit material aid; and emphasize the need for sustained pressure to end apartheid.

Brian Thami Hlongwa: Vice President of SAYCO (Southern Transvaal Region) and ANC member; served on the Soweto Youth Congress executive committee; a founder member of SAYCO; detained under emergency regulations 1987-89.

Mpho Lekgoro National Media and Information Officer of SAYCO; former branch chairperson of the Congress of South African Students (COSAS - Atteridgeville). Detained in 1987 and 1988, released after a long hunger strike.
