# CALL TO A MORAL AND SPIRITUAL REVOLUTION




"The war in Vietnam is but a symptom of a far deeper malady within the American spirit, and if we ignore this sobering reality, we will find ourselves organizing...for the next generation. [We] will be concerned about Thailand and Cambodia. [We] will be concerned about Guatemala and Peru. [We] will be concerned about Mozambique and South Africa. We will be marching for these and a dozen other names and attending rallies without end unless there is a significant and profound change in American life and policy. Such thoughts take us beyond Vietnam, but not beyond our calling as children of the living God." MARTIN LUTHER KING APRIL 4, 1967

It is now 20 years later and we are embroiled in a war in Central America, and we continue to support the apartheid regime in South Africa. While billions are spent on these policies, the homeless in America now number 3 million and 30% of the nation lives below the poverty level. As Martin Luther King prophesied, "poverty, urban problems and social progress generally are ignored when the guns of war become a national obsession."

Just as King saw a call to end the Vietnam war as an important step toward a moral and spiritual revolution, so today we are called to:

- Support peace and freedom in Central America and Southern Africa
- · Stop the U.S. war in Central America
- Stop U.S. government and corporate support for apartheid
- Stop U.S. aid to the Contras! Stop U.S. aid to UNITA!
- Build security at home by funding human needs.

On April 4, 1987, people of conscience will come together for a celebration that is a call to commitment and action.
