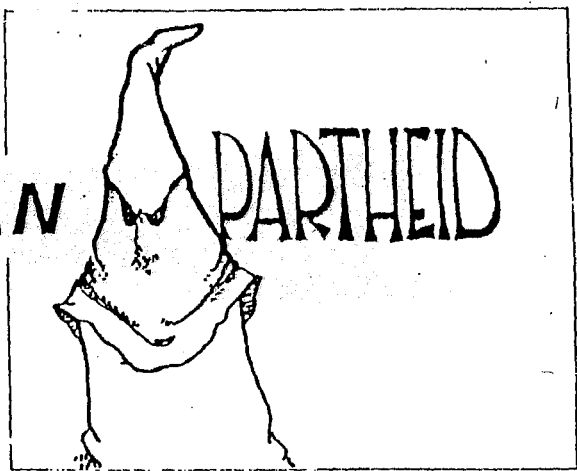


# UNIONS & SOUTH AFRICAN



The South African trade union movement is in the forefront of the struggle against racist apartheid in South Africa.

Why?

\*Africans who are 72 percent of the South African population are not permitted to vote.

\*Africans cannot live or work where they choose.

\*An African earns 22 cents for every \$1.00 earned by a white worker.

\*20 percent of black workers are unemployed.

\*Unions are restricted and strikes are illegal. Several hundred trade unionists have been jailed, tortured, and killed by South African security police.

Meanwhile profit rich U.S. Corporations in South Africa backed by the Reagan administration. . .

\*pay South African taxes used to finance police repression.
