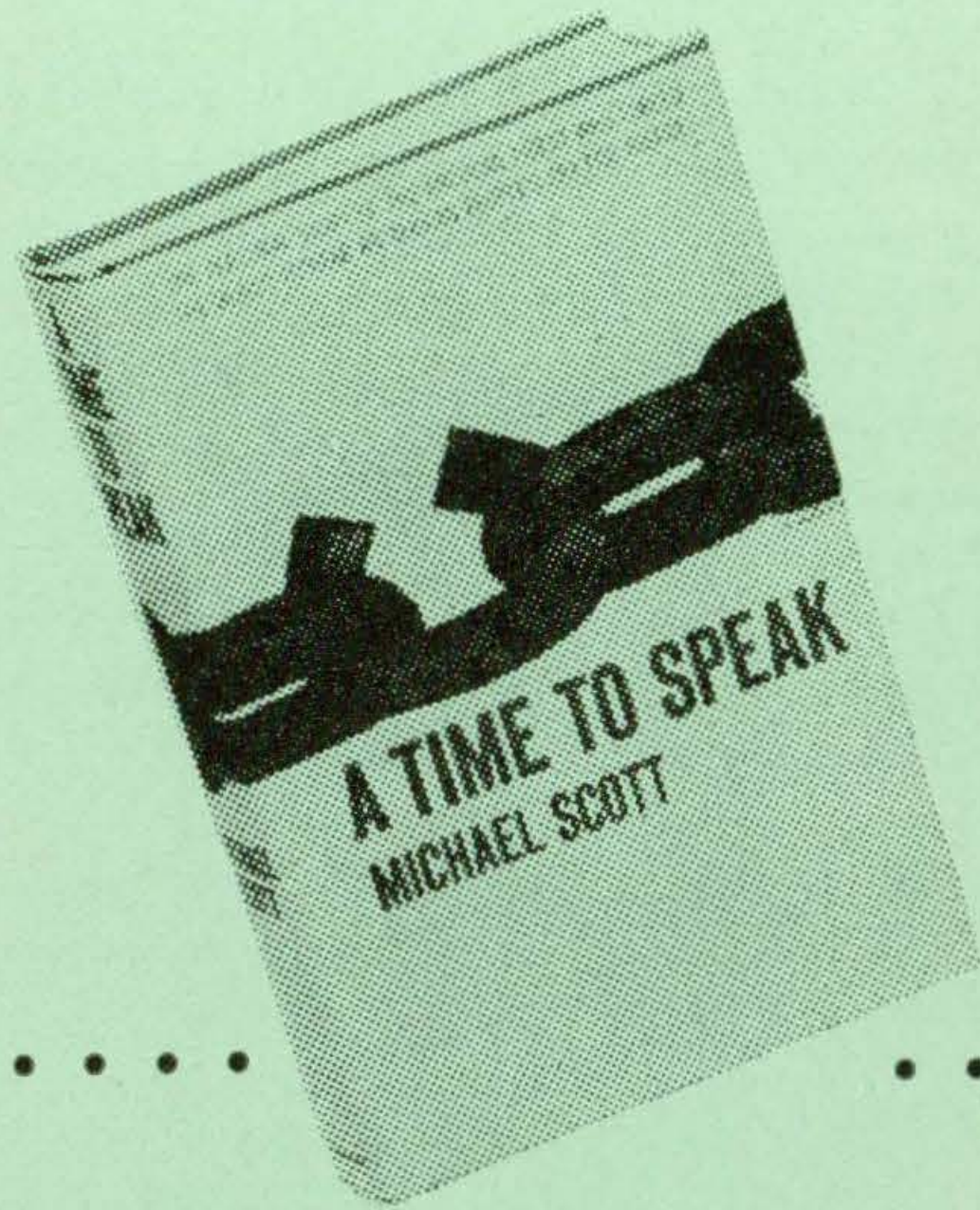

1. WAR IN ALGERIA: Is Confederation the Answer? *Lorna Hahn*. 32 pp. Reduced to 25¢ postpaid.

Citing a wealth of necessary information about Algeria's past history and present dilemma in this study, Mrs. Hahn makes a strong case for a confederation of Tunisia, Morocco, and Algeria as a solution to the catastrophic war. The author is a specialist on North African affairs at Temple University, and has traveled and studied extensively in that area of the continent.

2. PORTUGAL'S AFRICAN "WARDS"—A First-Hand Report on Labor and Education in Mozambique. *Marvin Harris*. (Second printing.) 36 pp. 50¢ postpaid.

This is the first documented survey on conditions of forced labor in Portuguese East Africa to be published in the United States in thirty years. The author describes many of the most alarming features of Portugal's colonial policy which results in the subjection and economic exploitation of 99 percent of the population. Dr. Harris, Assistant Professor of Anthropology at Columbia University, bases his report on research in Mozambique during 1956-57.

3. KENYA FACES THE FUTURE. *Tom Mboya*. (Out of print.)

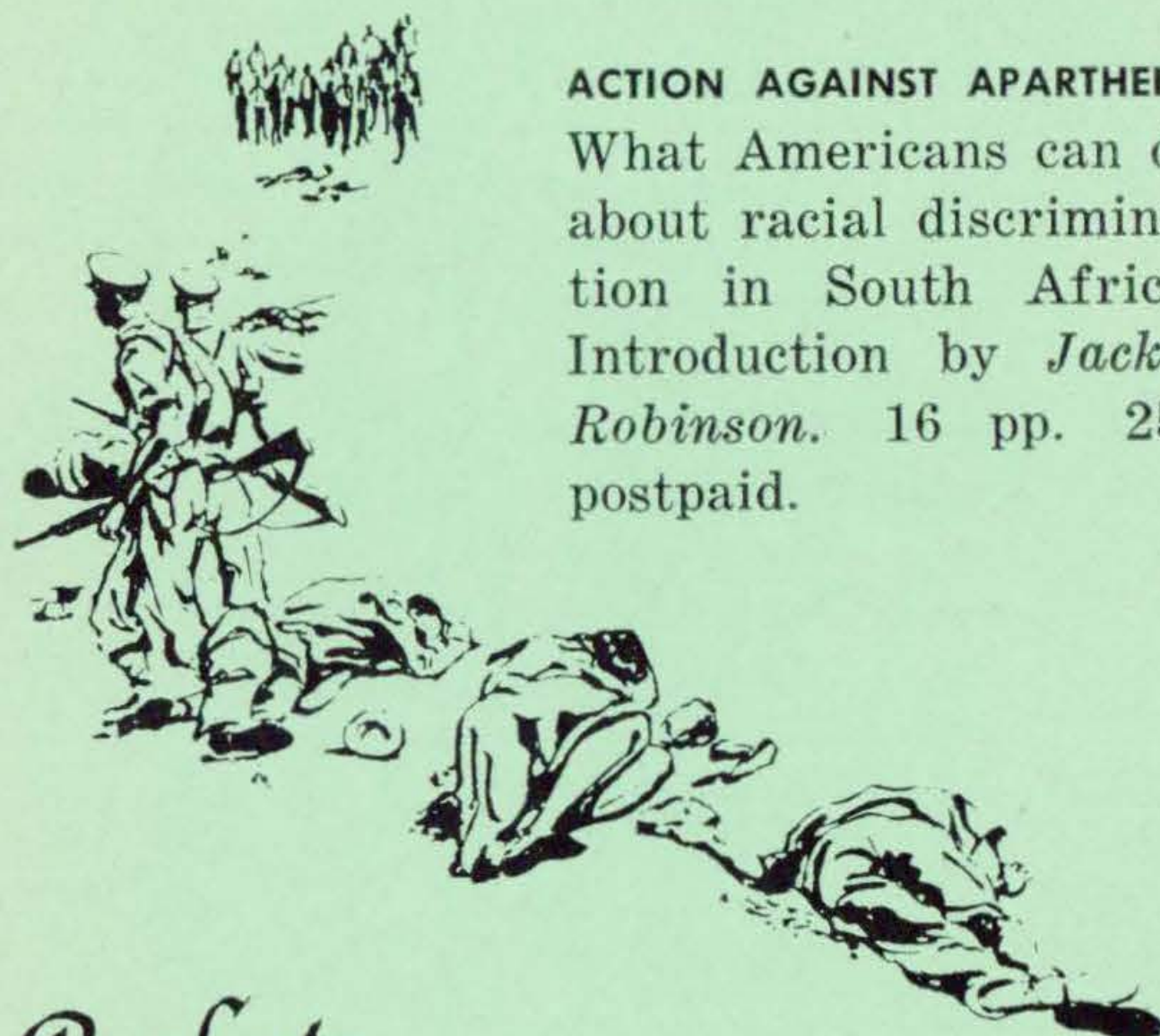
