RADIOS

For seven years the Mozambique Liberation Front, FRELIMO, has fought a fierce war against the Portuguese. The colonial power, Portugal, is the most underdeveloped country in Europe and has been a police state for more than forty years.

Until FRELIMO began its armed struggle against the Portuguese colonialists, the people of Mozambique had lived under a racist and authoritarian regime which had systematically suppressed all peaceful movements for reform.

Over the past seven years FRELIMO has gained control of the northern fifth of the countryside in Mozambique and is now making new advances in the western, and strategically crucial, province of Tete (site of the Cabora Bassa Dam).

The people of Mozambique have stood firm against napalm and phosphorous bombing, against the Portuguese military policy of burning villages and indiscriminately killing civilians, and they have begun to build themselves a new life.

FREEDOM

In northern Mozambique thousands of people have won their freedom. The people of Mozambique themselves control their land. They are free to construct hospitals, build schools and reorganize their agriculture on a co-operative system.

In the reconstructed areas of Mozambique FRELIMO needs to establish communication between villages. FRELIMO has radio broadcasts to explain the liberation struggle and the meaning of the Portuguese propaganda to the people. The Liberation Front broadcasts important news and world events as well.

Every village in the liberated areas of Mozambique needs radios to hear FRELIMO broadcasts. With these radios FRELIMO can remain in contact with even the most remote village.

In a recent issue of Mozambique Revolution (oct-Dec, 1970) FRELIMO said:

"For us particularly in view of difficult communications and because of illiteracy, radio is an extremely efficient way of mobilising the population. The problem we face is a lack of radios. We are launching a campaign to obtain radios for distribution in the liberated areas."
