A common concern in the Arabian Sea is the recent increase of Harmful Algal Blooms and the potential impacts of the changing plankton communities on social, ecological and economic health, due to the introduction of non-native species by anthropogenic means, notably ballast water release and hull biofouling.

Experts in the field of aquatic biological invasions have prepared articles and they were published as the AEHM Marine Invasive Species (MIS-OMAN) special issue ([Volume 18\(3\)](#)).

Despite having been published only six months ago, at the time this article was prepared, every article in the issue is included in the AEHM's top 20 most downloaded articles of all time.

Of particular note are the articles by

MIS-Oman keynote speakers Dr. Sarah Bailey (Fisheries and Oceans, Canada) and Dr. Martin Kernan (Principal Research Consultant and Project Manager, United Kingdom).

With 942 views and climbing, Dr. Bailey's article entitled "*An overview of thirty years of research on ballast water as a vector for aquatic invasive species to freshwater and marine environments*" provides a fantastic review of the history of aquatic invasive species studies.

Also, Dr. Kernan's climate change article entitled "*Climate change and the impact of invasive species on aquatic ecosystems*" has an amazing 846 views.
